



Hatton (Cruden) Snow Day Activities



P5/6 Class

Here are some suggested activities to do whilst you are at home during any snow days this session. You do not have to complete all the activities each day. Please share any activities when you are back in school.

Build a snowman measuring less than 50cm tall with a girth of about 1 metre.	Make 3D shapes from snow and build a snow robot. How many different shapes have you used?	Make a paper snowflake.	Write a short poem about a winter's day using a range of imagery) e.g. similes, metaphors and personification).
Write a snow/winter alphabet (e.g. A – avalanche, B – blizzard).	Look out of your window and create a detailed drawing of what you see.	Design a front cover for a book you have read recently and write a blurb that would make people want to read it.	Write a winter poem using rhyming language.
Make you own hot chocolate.	Create an A to Z of cold, snow and ice. Find one word for each letter of the alphabet. Use a dictionary or thesaurus to help.	Find a healthy recipe (e.g. soup) and make it. Write your own set of instructions.	Make up a circuit of activities you could do in the snow.
Measure the snow using a ruler in one place. Keep a note each hour of how much it increases or decreases. You could then make a graph to chart the changes.	Write out 20 sums which include adding or subtracting thousands, hundreds, tens and ones.	Investigate snow and ice. How long does it take to melt in different locations? Write out your experiment and include what you did, your results and conclusions.	You have a budget of £100 to spend on a party for 10 people. Everyone needs something to eat and drink. Use a supermarket website to cost up your party plan.
