# **Primary 1 Enrolments**

All children who reach their 5th birthday by 28th February 2025 are invited to register for Primary 1 admission in August 2024. Parents can apply to schools in their catchment area, or they can place an out of zone request when applying for a school. For further information, please see the letter which was sent out at the same time as this newsletter. It would be helpful if you could let the wider community know about the enrolments taking place from Monday 15<sup>th</sup> – Friday 19<sup>th</sup> January.

# **Changes to School Gate Entrance**

In consultation with Aberdeenshire Council's property service and janitorial team, all pupils, parents/ carers, visitors, and staff are to use our main entrance to enter our school. The double gates at the top of the lane are for access only. On a daily basis, this access entry will only be used for our catering team and may be used pupils taking their bicycles/ scooters to school. Anyone else (including visitors/ council workers) who need to use these gates to access the school e.g., for deliveries, must come straight to the school office first to be granted access. Having participated in various risk assessment procedures, I have deemed it necessary to still use these gates at the end of the school day to support the pupils' departure from school. Therefore, those pupils who already depart from here will still leave these gates at the end of the school day. This will be introduced as of **Monday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2024**. Within the next two weeks we will be putting the following measures in place to support this transition

- Discussions will be held in our assemblies to inform the pupils of this change.
- Our P1.2 & P2.3 classes will spend some time practising coming into through the main gate and walking up to the annexe playground for those who aren't used to entering through this way. All pupils who get the school bus already enter via the main gate and so will already be used to doing this.
- Your child can begin to use the main entrance straight away whilst you
  wait in the lane so you can support them with entering if this is
  something you think they may need extra practice with.

I would like to thank you in advance for your support and co-operation with this.

### Adverse weather



# **Clever Touch Screen Fundraising Update**

As many of you will already know we received a grant of over £10, 175 to get new clever touch screens installed to each of our 5 classes and are fundraising the rest to have them installed. To get all 5 classes installed with these clever touch screens it will cost a total of £19, 481. We are overwhelmed by the tremendous support we have had from our pupils, parents and wider school community meaning that we are well on our way to reaching our fundraising goal. On behalf of all pupils and staff at Hatton (Cruden) School I would like to thank

This means, that along with the £1000 we won as part of the Evening Express competition, our total so far is £4065.58. There is still more to come with some of the money raised at the Parent Council's shopping event to be added.

## **Scots Show Fundraiser**

Robert Burns day is traditionally celebrated on 25<sup>th</sup> January every year. To mark this occasion, our entire school is going to take part in a Scots Poetry Competition where they will rehearse a Scots Poem to present this to their class. Three pupils will then be chosen from each class to then present their poem in front of Mrs Beattie who will choose the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners. The pupils will receive more information from their class teachers if they have not done so already. We are also planning to have a Scots Show this term where pupils will have the opportunity to recite their poems to parents and carers. More information about this will be coming very soon.
